

### Introduction

MacAppStuff Sounds is a simple, easy to use music player. You can quickly locate and add music to play lists which can be easily saved and loaded. Below you will find help of the basic operation of the application, some features of the application (such as Mute, volume control etc are self-explanatory).

## Playlists

### Creating a playlist

Click the left plus (+) button and enter a name for your playlist in the window which appears. Playlists are stored in a folder in your Preferences, and can be backed up using the option in Preferences.

### Opening/selecting a playlist to play

Simply double-click the playlist name in the window.

### Changing the name of a playlist

Select “Save as” from the File menu and enter a name for the playlist. If a playlist of the same name exists, you will be asked whether to overwrite it.

### Deleting a playlist

Select the playlists you want to delete in the list and click left minus (-) button.

## Tracks

### Adding tracks

You can drag/drop music files from other applications (such as Finder) onto the tracklist window, or click the right add (+) button. If no playlist has been defined you will be asked to create one.

You can move tracks up and down the tracklist window by selecting them and dragging them with the mouse, allowing re-ordering.

*Tip: When a track is playing, clicking its name next to the green LED will highlight the track in the track list.*

### Removing tracks

Select the tracks you want to remove in the tracklist (you can hold down SHIFT or CMD to highlight a number of tracks), then click the right minus (-) button. The actual files are NOT deleted.


## Import from iTunes

Music playback must be stopped before you can use this feature.

Click the “Load playlists from iTunes” button and wait for the playlists to appear. Click the “Import the selected playlist(s)” button and wait for the import to complete. You can select multiple playlists to import.

Any existing playlists in MacAppStuff Sounds which have the same name as import ones from iTunes will be overwritten/updated by the iTunes playlists.

# Preferences



## Confirm deletions

When 'checked' this option will ask you to confirm the removal of playlists and tracks when you choose to delete them.

## Start track position when application quits

The position within the track you were playing the last time you used the application will be resumed when you next use the application.

## Start playing last played track when application starts

Whichever track you were playing the last time you used the application, it will be played again when you next start the application (providing it still exists).

## Start playing when a playlist is opened

When you open a playlist the first track is played (and any subsequent ones).

## Start playing files dropped into the track list (drag/drop)

When one or more files are dropped into the track list, the first one in the dropped list will be played.

## Start playing after a shuffle

After you have shuffled the tracks, the first track in the list will be played.

## Remove non-existent files from the track list

Automatically remove songs from the track list which no longer exist. However, if some of your songs are stored on an external drive which you turn on and off, you may want to leave this option unchecked. That way, your track list stays intact and ready for the next time you turn the drive on. The tracks will be shown in a red colour if they do not exist.

## Receive Apple Remote commands

When this option is checked you can use the Apple Remote control as follows:

- Play/Pause button: Play/pause current track.
- Volume +/- buttons: Increase/decrease the volume.

- Next/Previous buttons: Click once to jump to next/previous track, or hold to skip through the current track forwards/backwards.
- Menu button: Click to stop playback, hold down longer to minimize the application.

Note: This remote feature may not work when some other remote control capture applications are running. You will need to quit those applications.

### **Backup playlists**

Click the button and supply a folder to backup to.

To perform a manual backup, simply copy the folder located at *~/Library/Preferences/MacAppStuff/MacAppStuff Sounds playlists* to the location of your choosing.

### **Restore playlists**

Click the button and choose a folder to restore from. Any existing playlists will be overwritten. To perform a manual restore, simply copy the contents of the folder containing the playlists you want to restore to

*~/Library/Preferences/MacAppStuff/MacAppStuff Sounds playlists*

## **Trial Limitations**

The trial is designed to run for 14 days. After this time you will either need to purchase a license from our website (see below), or remove it from your computer. The trial is limited in that you can only have 2 playlists with 10 items in each. Also, resuming of last track played when app starts will not work.

## **How to buy**

If you are truly satisfied with the software and have fully evaluated it for 14 days, you can purchase a license online from our website (go to the product page and click the Buy button).

PayPal handle our payments. You need a working email address to purchase the software. Once you have made your purchase, you will receive an email from PayPal confirming the transaction, and an email from us (usually within 24 - 48 hours) which will include you're your license and a download link to the software.

Your license becomes void if it is used by someone else to activate the software, if a refund is issued or your payment is fraudulent.
